

Wellcome Collection, London.—In Christ Raises Lazarus from His Tomb, British engraver Robert William Sievier etches the powerful moment from John 11 when Jesus calls Lazarus out of death and into life. At the center, Christ extends his arm with divine authority, commanding resurrection. Lazarus, still wrapped in grave cloths, emerges from the tomb as witnesses look on in astonishment, wonder, and reverence. The depiction draws the viewer into the heart of the miracle. It is a summons to live with hope, to walk forward when Christ calls, and to believe that nothing is ever beyond the reach of God's renewal.

As part of our commitment to transparency and to deepen our shared understanding of church finances, the Finance Committee is now providing monthly updates on giving. From January through June, year-to-date contributions were \$169,105 below our budgeted goal. While we planned for a seasonal dip in giving, contributions are currently tracking below even those adjusted summer expectations.

Sanctuary Singers (new!) is an intergenerational choir for teens and adults that begins rehearsals September 10. This Community of Belonging (COB) meets Wednesdays from 6:45-7:45 p.m. and sings in select 11:00 a.m. services throughout the year. It's teaching-focused and friendly for amateur singers. Led by Joey Fala.

Sanctuary Choir is our adult choir that sings the traditional choral repertoire and includes many professional musicians and anyone is welcome to join. It rehearses on Wednesdays from 6:00–6:45 p.m. and sings weekly at both services. Children's Choir for ages 4 through 6th grade will meet as a part of Children's Sunday School from 9:45–10:45 a.m., beginning in September. Children learn basic musical skills through fun, simple songs and help lead worship during the semester. Led by Kevin Salter.

Women's Chorale will rehearse September 14, 21, and 28 from 9:45–10:00 a.m. and will sing more advanced music on September 28 in worship. With only two rehearsals, it's best for confident singers. Led by Dr. Raphael Bundage.
