Originally printed in Martin Luther's Little Prayer Book, the image would have served as a daily visual comfort for believers. The sheep, cradled in Christ's arms, reminds us of Luke 12:32—"Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." In a world of uncertainty, this image speaks quietly of Jesus' steady care and watchfulness over his flock. We are never out of his reach.

## Sanctuary Singers (new!) is an

intergenerational choir for teens and adults that begins rehearsals September 10. This Community of Belonging (COB) meets Wednesdays from 6:45-7:45 p.m. and sings in select 11:00 a.m. services throughout the year. It's teaching-focused and friendly for amateur singers. Led by Joey Fala.

**Sanctuary Choir** is our adult choir that sings the traditional choral repertoire and includes many professional musicians and anyone is welcome to join.
